ERIC BOLE (ALUMNI STAFF 1948-1951)

A new biography by J. R. Suber tells the story of a Fan Court teacher and rugby coach, Eric Bole, who captained Cambridge University in 1945



and 1947. As well as playing for England in six un-capped matches during the Victory Internationals Eric also played county rugby for Lancashire. His years at Fan Court (1948-1951) play a short, but important part of the story. It was at Fan Court where Bole met his wife, Lorraine Abbott, a matron at the school. In 1951, Eric and Lorraine married and moved to the US where they continued to work in schools.

ALUMNI VISITS



PRE-PREP AND NURSERY SPORTS MORNING



DID YOU KNOW?







SIR SYDNEY CAMM (1940-1946)

Born in Windsor on 5 August 1893, Sydney Camm was the oldest of twelve children and the son of an accomplished carpenter. He was awarded a scholarship to the Royal Free School, but left to follow in his father's footsteps. A lifelong love of planes led him to set up the Windsor Model Plane Club in 1912, where he met his wife, Hilda, the sister of a fellow club member and hey had one child, a daughter.

Shortly before the First World War, Camm began working as a carpenter at the British aircraft and motorcycle manufacturer, Martinsyde in Weybridge. He was promoted to the drawing office where he spent the remainder of the war. In 1922 he went to work for George Handasyde one of the leading aircraft designers at that time, then in 1923 he joined the Hawker Aviation Company (later known as Hawker Siddeley).

At the outbreak of World War Two the decision was made to relocate Claremont School girls to Wales; at the same time Hawker Aircraft were looking to relocate their drawing offices from Kingston to avoid being bombed. Claremont mansion was leased to Hawker Aircraft for six years and housed the main design offices, whilst the belvedere was used as a watch tower by the home guard.

Camm worked for Hawker Aircraft until his retirement in 1965, during that time he designed more than 52 different types of aircraft, including the Cygnet and his most famous, the Hawker Hurricane, which proved instrumental during the Battle of Britain. He remained on the board of Hawker's successor company, Hawker Siddeley, which merged with British Aerospace, now BAE Systems.

A resident of Thames Ditton for over 30 years, he died playing golf in Richmond in 1966, aged 72.

ALUMNI EXHIBITION

We invited Kingston Aviation to join us in this year's summer meeting exhibition tent. Entries from the Prep School's humanities competition that focussed on the history of the school were displayed inside and visitors were invited to learn more about the part the mansion played in the second world war.





FOND FAREWELLS

Mr David Nanson joined Claremont Fan Court School over 25 years ago, during which time he took on a range of roles and responsibilities from head of PE to teaching French and Spanish. He also met his wife Karen at Claremont and both his daughters attended the school.

Mrs Deborah Casey is also retiring after 20 years of teaching in the Prep School. She will be missed by pupils and colleagues alike and plans to spend more time with her family and see more of the world.

We wish them both the best of luck in their retirements.




