INTRODUCTION

We offer a number of scholarships to outstanding applicants from our current pupils in the junior school when joining the senior school in Year 7. Scholarships available for Year 7 entry:

- Academic
- All-rounder
- Music

Applicants are welcome to apply for more than one scholarship if appropriate.

REQUIREMENTS

Scholarships awarded at Year 7 are awarded for the period up to the end of Year 11, subject to an annual review. Please refer to the individual scholarship pages for further details on individual scholarship requirements.

Our scholarship students are expected to play an active part in the school for those areas they have been awarded a scholarship, as well as uphold a level of commitment to the wider school community including assisting at our open events.

LEVEL OF SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Academic and All-rounder Scholarships awarded at Year 7 are worth up to £1000 each academic year.

Music scholarships awarded at Year 7 are worth £1000 each academic year together with free tuition at school in one instrument. In addition, we have a separate award known as the Wienpahl music scholarship. This is awarded where a pupil demonstrates outstanding potential in the development of their musical ability and experience, with the expectation that they will achieve exceptional musical standards in their school musical career. This award brings £2000 fees remission each academic year.

WHAT IS THE APPLICATION PROCESS?

Applications should be made for all scholarships, including the academic scholarship. Application forms should be completed via the application form by **Monday 4 November 2024**. Application forms will be sent to all current Year 6 families early in the autumn term.

Applicants are asked to submit a **Pupil Statement**, written by the student themselves, giving an overview of their interests and outside activities relevant to their scholarship application, including a little about their possible contribution to the school and future aspirations. All-rounder and music applications may also be accompanied by **references** provided to support their performance in their chosen specialisms at the time of submissions (though these references are optional). These should all be submitted by email at admissions@claremont.surrey.sch.uk by **Monday 4 November 2024**.

Successful applicants for all scholarships awarded will be advised in late January.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP



ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Academic scholarships are awarded on the basis of a very high performance in the academic assessments together with their achievement in the interview process.

SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Applications are invited from students in Year 6 of the junior school for an academic scholarship for entry into Year 7, using the application form on our [website](#).

Applicants are invited to attend the academic assessment on 30 November 2024, to sit assessments in English, mathematics and non-verbal reasoning.

Those who have achieved high standards in the academic assessment papers will be invited through to the scholarship interviews in January 2025. These are held during the school day and pupils can be accompanied by a member of the junior school staff to the interview unless parents wish to make alternative arrangements.

SCHOLARSHIP EXPECTATIONS

Academic scholarships are dependent on maintaining a high overall standard of achievement, effort and behaviour on the half termly grade cards and full report namely:

- achievement grades of A*/A and B in Years 7-9 and grades 6 and above in Years 10 and 11
- endeavour grades of 1-2 in Years 7-9 and grade W or H in Years 10 and 11.

ALL-ROUNDER SCHOLARSHIP



ALL-ROUNDER SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants applying for an all-rounder scholarship are expected to achieve high standards in the academic assessment and also offer strong evidence of success in at least **two** of the following areas:

- Art
- Drama
- Music
- Sport5
- Citizenship

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

The criteria for the award are as follows:

- Applicants must achieve high standards in the assessment papers taken in November (English, mathematics and non-verbal reasoning).
- Applicants should also offer strong evidence of success in at least two of the following:
 - **Music:** voice or instrument at Grade 3 level
 - **Sport:** compete at club, district level or county level in a Claremont representative school sport* or a range of sports at school and club level (to include a Claremont representative school sport)
 - **Art:** demonstrate an aptitude for art by presenting a portfolio
 - **Drama:** perform at a high level at school, club or equivalent
 - **Citizenship:** have demonstrated exceptional qualities and examples of citizenship at school, church and youth organisations

ARE ALL APPLICANTS ASSESSED?

Invitation to a scholarship assessment is not automatic - the senior leadership team carefully consider all all-rounder applications received and those who have achieved high standards in the academic assessment papers will be invited through to the scholarship assessments in January.

These are held during the school day and pupils can be accompanied by a member of the Junior School staff to the interview unless parents wish to make alternative arrangements.

SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Applicants invited through to the scholarship assessments will be asked to attend an interview with a senior leader from the school in which we will seek evidence of an inquiring mind, breadth of knowledge and sound moral judgement.

Scholarship assessments are held during the interview period in January, and students should be prepared to attend scholarship assessments in their chosen fields, in addition to the entrance interview, as follows:

- Art – to attend an assessment with our art department to include a drawing test, presentation of an art portfolio and interview with the Head of art.
- Drama – to attend an assessment with our Head of drama, to include a monologue performance.

- Music – to attend an assessment with our Head of music, to include musical performance in their preferred instrument and sight reading test.
- Sport – to attend a sports practical with our sports department in one or more of the Claremont representative sports*.
- Citizenship – to attend a citizenship interview to discuss and demonstrate their exceptional qualities in this area.

*Claremont representative sports assessed for scholarship are rugby, football, lacrosse, netball, cricket and tennis.

Successful applicants will be advised in late January.

SCHOLARSHIP EXPECTATIONS

Depending on the strengths offered, applicants must be committed to attending practices and activities and to participating in all team matches for which he or she is selected, as well as contributing to wider school life and attending events and open days.

All-rounder scholarships are dependent on maintaining:

- a high overall standard of achievement, effort and behaviour (achievement grades of A* - C and endeavour grades of 1-2 on the half termly grade card and full report)
- continuation of the criteria above.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP



MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

This is a competitive process but the following criteria will be of assistance to applicants:

- All applicants will be required to pass the general entrance assessment to be considered for scholarship.
- All applicants should be able to demonstrate interest, commitment and achievement in music; for example by playing in an orchestra, singing in a choir or through grade examinations.
- All applicants need to offer two instruments (which may include voice) one of which should be at Grade 4 standard.

WIENPAHL MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

This is awarded where a pupil demonstrates outstanding potential in the development of their musical ability and experience, with the expectation that they will achieve exceptional musical standards in their school musical career. All applicants for a music scholarship will also be considered for this award (no specific, additional, application is required).

SCHOLARSHIP ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Auditions will be held in January 2025 for entry into the school the following September for all those students who have passed the general entrance assessment. The audition will consist of:

- Performing a piece with or without accompaniment (we can provide an accompanist if required)
- Rhythmic tests
- Sight-reading tests
- An interview will be held with a senior leader from the Senior School and the director of music. Applicants should be prepared to discuss:
 - the music that they have played
 - their musical achievements thus far
 - their musical plans for the future

SCHOLARSHIP EXPECTATIONS

Music scholars are expected to work hard to further their individual music studies and to make a significant contribution to the wider musical life of the school through participation in at least two ensembles and a variety of concerts and assemblies each term.

Scholarships are dependent on maintaining a high overall standard of achievement and endeavour and continuation of the criteria above.
